Discerning God's Vision and Mission for our Parishes

28 July 10am – 2.30pm

'Where there is no vision the people perish' Proverbs 29:18

Lewis Carroll said, 'If you don't know where you are going any road can take you there!' Earlier this year we were due to hold a 'Vision Day' to think about our vision for the future of our parish churches and our local communities.

Unfortunately, that day had to be cancelled, but we have another date for the diary – 28th July – so please put the date in your diaries if you haven't already done so and sign up on the sheets at the back of the church.

It has been said that, 'Church exists by mission, as fire exists by burning.' Mission is not an optional extra for particularly keen churches, it lies at the heart of why the church exists. However, unlike our other 'core activity' – worship – mission doesn't feature automatically on the agenda, meaning that instead of simply focusing on our own needs, we recognise the primacy of mission in all its forms and order our church life round reaching out in love to a world in need.

Why have a vision?

Churches that have a clear and communicable vision are more likely to be successful. They are working towards a shared goal and they are travelling on the journey together. It is essential that all they do is underpinned by prayer.

It is difficult to know where to focus efforts and resources without being able to articulate what it is we are trying to do. Imagine taking a holiday without first deciding where you are going or how you will get there! In church terms we need to clarify why the church exists and what we are doing now (mission) and what we would like to achieve (vision). The mission and vision is what determines our strategy, planning and budgeting.

If that all sounds too complicated; there are four simple questions we need to ask ourselves:

1. Where are we starting from?
2. Where are we going?

3. What is the best way to get there?
4. What do we need to do now?

In order to begin this exciting journey and discernment process, I have invited Revd. Tony Stephens to lead and facilitate a discussion to help us to discern God's vision and mission here in the Saltash area.

I would encourage you all to put the date in your diary and come along and be a part of this discernment process. Whether or not you can make the meeting please do begin praying for the meeting and its outcomes now.

So please remember, Saturday 28 July, 10am – 2.30pm – venue to be confirmed... and please put your name down on the sign-up sheet so that we know how many to cater for.
