Growing as Confident Disciples This Autumn

September always feels like a fresh start. The summer settles, routines return and many of us find ourselves ready to pick up something that strengthens faith and helps us grow as disciples. This year we are inviting the whole church to join **The Bible Course**. It is a simple and friendly way to deepen confidence in Scripture and confidence in sharing faith in everyday life.

One of the earliest Christian writers, Tertullian, who lived around 155 to 220 AD, wrote that Christians are made not born. It is a reminder that discipleship is a lifelong shaping. Confidence in faith grows as we learn, pray and practise. It grows as we let Scripture form us and as we allow the story of God to become the story we carry into our conversations and our relationships.

Tertullian also pointed to the power of ordinary Christian witness. People noticed how the early Christians lived with clarity and grace. Their lives made others curious. That same truth still holds. When we grow in confidence in our own faith we carry it more lightly and more joyfully. We become more willing to speak about it when the moment comes.

We can also draw on the wisdom of Bishop Lancelot Andrewes who lived

from 1555 to 1626. Andrewes understood that discipleship grows through steady practice. In his private devotions he prayed, "Be thou my pattern of all righteousness." His whole approach was simple. We become more confident disciples by living as disciples and as we grow in confidence we become a quiet invitation to others.

This is why **The Bible Course** matters. Over the sessions we will explore how the whole of Scripture fits together. We will look at the big story and the key themes and how God's purposes unfold. As understanding deepens, confidence grows. As confidence grows, witness becomes more natural.

Throughout September we will share short introductions across Facebook and the weekly email. If something speaks to you please share it. A personal invitation often opens a door for someone who has been quietly wondering how to begin.

Let us step into autumn as disciples who are growing in confidence. Confident in Scripture. Confident in Christ. Confident enough to let our lives make others curious.

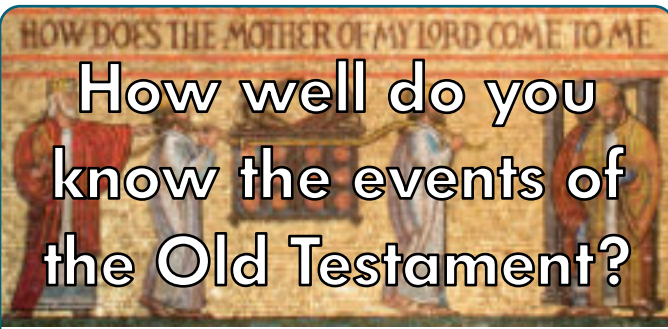

Summer with the Joint Choir

Musical Evening in Hatt

Our highlight was the combined Musical Evening with the Ukrainian Singers at Hatt House in July.

The ministry choir set the scene with patriotic songs from the first and second world wars with Faye leading Rule Britannia.

Two sessions of music from the regions of Ukraine were dramatically finished by a special composition, with a ballet dancer setting out the suffering of the people for all of Western Europe at the present time.



The hymn *I Vow To Thee My Country* was followed by both National Anthems and the *Anthem for Doomed Youth* with the *Reveille* by our talented local bugler.

The Mayor thanked our hosts, Heugh & Fiona, and flowers were presented to Fe and the Mayoress by Alisa, a local young exile. £1,000 was raised for the relief fund.

Saltash Abbeyfield

A second visit to Saltash Abbeyfield was made in early August, following a high tea to celebrate 70 years since Richard Carr-Gomme started the movement.

The Mayor, who is a trustee, came with Maxine to the event and all present enjoyed the special history of the Saltash Society for the last 53 years.

A tribute started the evening to the life of John Noakes, who had died recently at 101, with Faye singing *Rest in the Lord*.

The singing of the choir was greatly uplifted by the enthusiasm of the residents' contribution to every song.

The choir will be leading the singing at the combined service at St Erney on 30 August.

Events

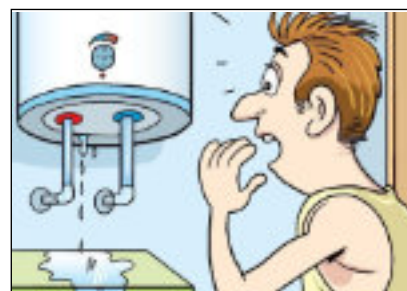
During August we held two events, a bacon buttie morning and a toasted sandwich morning.

The Faces in the Tower

Have you noticed them? If you walk up the path from the entrance of St Stephen's and look up at the tower, you will see the slate vents near the top of the tower, and maybe the faces looking at you.



This could be accidental, or maybe a joke by the Fifteenth Century builders of the tower. Perhaps it is just an example of pareidolia, the human tendency to see faces in natural objects, such as clouds. But there they are, medieval emojis expressing happiness, sadness, surprise, confusion – even silliness (one is upside down!) – and more. Just take a look.

Throughout our lives, we come to church bringing with us every emotion. Of course, the vents are there as part of the bell chamber, allowing our church bells to sound out the events of our lives – the happiness of weddings, the sadness of funerals with the bells muffled, important national events and just marking the passing of each week and expressive of home. As one of our Cornish poets put it:

... the Sabbath bell

**Sweet as the chaunt the herald angels sang,
The merry marriage peal, the parting knell...**

Those faces have seen it all, and express God's acceptance of us as we come to church just as we are, whatever may be on our mind, "through all the changing scenes of life".
